

European Union Discuss the Tragic Events at the German Refugee Camp

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After the recent attacks on German refugee camps the German delegation was outraged. The Czech Republic still denied the German claims that they were the root of the attack. Although the Czech Republic refuted Germany's claims, they used the crisis at hand to show the importance of stopping the extremism and xenophobia at the source instead of letting it grow to the point of extreme violence. The delegate of Germany responded "Germany is appalled" and continued to state that actions needed to be taken to insure the safety of the citizen that were left tense after the attacks. France led to the conclusion that the far-right neo-Nazi group that attacked the German Refugee camp was uneducated and educating groups of migrants would assist in the lessening of xenophobic and extremist actions. France stated "ignorance and unawareness is the cause." Switzerland fired back saying that although education may be part of the solution it will not bring a halt to the topic at hand. The delegate of Liechtenstein came to Czech Republic's aid against the ridicule of other nations by suggesting more border security and suggesting "use my funds to help build border security." The United Kingdom responded that "Czech Republic to some extent should be held accountable," when questioned about the attack. In response, the Czech Republic continued to deny the German accusations saying that the European Union should be able to track these groups to prevent further attacks on other nations. After the moderated caucus was finished the committee moved into an unmoderated caucus and continued to work on their working papers. In a later interview with France she believed that the session was going well and the European Union was establishing strong connections.
